OVERVIEW Historic Lake Crescent Lodge, built in 1916 as "Singers Tavern" in Olympic National Park serves as an ideal base camp for the variety of recreational activities in the park while allowing guests to experience the charm of a turn-of-the-century resort. The comfortable, spacious guest rooms are nestled among the giant fir and hemlock trees on the shore of beautiful Lake Crescent and offer wonderful views of the lake.

LODGING

Historic Lake Crescent Lodge Rooms – Lodge Rooms are located on the second floor of the historic Lake Crescent Lodge, offering stunning lake views and a central bathroom/shower. Seasonal rates vary from \$89 -\$105, plus taxes and fees.

Storm King Rooms – Located in the two-story guest building that offers many of the comforts of home, these rooms keep with the character of a serene and tranquil retreat and do not have TVs or telephones. These units offer one queen bed, a porch or balcony, and shower-only bathrooms. Seasonal rates vary from \$119-\$159, plus taxes and fees.

Marymere Rooms – Sitting alongside beautiful Lake Crescent and a short distance from the Historic Lake Crescent Lodge, is a single-story guest building that houses the Marymere Rooms. These rooms offer a more contemporary experience but without the distractions of a TV or telephone. Marymere rooms include two queen beds, a full bathroom, and a porch with breathtaking views of the lake and mountains. Seasonal rates vary from \$129-\$164, plus taxes and fees.

Pyramid Mountain Rooms – Quietly nestled among the towering trees is a two-story building that houses the Pyramid Mountain Rooms. These rooms offer a tranquil place where guests can watch deer feed in the meadow outside the windows or sit on the porch (or balcony) and simply take in the magnificent lake and mountain views. Pyramid Mountain rooms offer two queen beds, a full bathroom, a porch or balcony, and the blissful sounds of nature all around. TVs and telephones are not provided in these wonderfully secluded rooms. The ADA-friendly rooms offer one queen bed and a full bathroom (no roll-in shower). Seasonal rates vary from \$129-\$169, plus taxes and fees.

Singer Tavern Cottages – For those who seek more privacy, the Singer Tavern Cottages offer 10 one-bedroom cottages and three two-bedroom cottages – all with lake and mountain views. The Singer Tavern Cottages were built following the design and footprint of the original cottages from 1916, which will make guests feel as though they have stepped back in time.

- **Two-bedroom Singer Tavern Cottages** feature two queen beds in one room and one queen bed in the other, along with a full bathroom, a mini-fridge, and a beautiful porch where guests can sit in the wicker chairs and soak up the stunning lake views. Seasonal rates vary from \$179-\$219, plus taxes and fees.
- **One-bedroom Singer Tavern Cottages** feature two queen beds, a full bathroom, a mini-fridge, and a beautiful porch with fabulous views. Rates start at \$182. plus tax. Seasonal rates vary from \$149-\$189, plus taxes and fees.

Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages – Listed on the National Register for Historic Places, the Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages offer a warm and luring fireplace – perfect for settling in and reading a book - and lake and mountain views that are indescribable. All Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages are located along the shores of Lake Crescent. The Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages are available daily during the summer season and weekends only (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) in the winter..

- **Two-bedroom Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages** include two double beds in one bedroom and one queen bed in the other. These cottages feature a fireplace, a full bathroom, a microwave, a mini-fridge, and lots of tranquility (no TV or telephone). Seasonal rates vary from \$209-\$239, plus taxes and fees
- **One-Bedroom Roosevelt Fireplace Cottages** include two queen beds in the bedroom, a fireplace, a shower-only bathroom, a microwave, a mini-fridge, and no intrusions of a TV or telephone. Seasonal rates vary from \$199-\$229, plus taxes and fees

DINING

The lakefront dining room overlooks Lake Crescent and offers breakfast, lunch and dinner from early May to mid October. The Lodge promotes wines from award winning Pacific Northwest wine regions

ACTIVITIES

Hiking – The Marymere Falls Trail is 3/4 of a mile from the Storm King Ranger Station. The 90-foot drop from Falls Creek into a small plunge pool is a fairly flat hike through old growth forest, except for the final approach, which is fairly

steep. The falls is generally available for year-round views, and during the summer months the National Park offers nature tours.

During the summer season a hike to mile-high Hurricane Hill on a clear day can offer a 360-degree view, north across the Straits of Juan de Fuca to Victoria, Canada or the southern view of the glacier clad Mount Olympus. While walking the trail view sub-alpine flowers like lupine, Indian Paintbrush and avalanche lilies.

Starting at Fairholme General Store, guests can continue on down the Camp David Junior Road on the north side of Lake Crescent from Fairholme to hook up with the Olympic Discovery Trail and the Spruce Railroad Trail, which takes guests near a couple of train tunnels.

Fishing – Lake Crescent is known for its one-of-a-kind Beardsley Trout, identified by its unusual head that takes up a third of its body. The lake has become a strictly catch and release for the past few years in hopes of bringing back the native Beardsley and Crescenti Trout populations. A limited supply of fishing equipment is available at the lodge, but guests are welcome to bring their own rod, reel and wading gear, as the lake is renowned for its fly fishing.

Boating – Explore the glacier-carved Lake Crescent with a rowboat rental from Lake Crescent Lodge. Guests can fish, have a picnic lunch or just drift with the breeze and bask in the warm sunshine. The lake is known for its crystal clear water that is over 600 feet deep in parts. Many private residents who live around the lake still get their drinking water directly from the lake.

MANAGEMENT

Lake Crescent Lodge is managed by ARAMARK Parks and Destinations, and is authorized by the National Park Service and the Department of the Interior to serve the public within Olympic National Park.
